This, That & The Other...our genealogy and history corner

John Edwards was the first Edwards to come into Yancey County then known as Burke. He was born in 1750 in Baltimore, Maryland. From there he moved to McAllister, PA. then moved to Bedford, VA where he resided until the Revolutionary War. His pension records show he volunteered and served several hitches in the army before coming to Jonesboro, TN, His sister Mary had married Christopher Taylor, and they ran a boarding house in Jonesboro. One of their boarders was Andrew Jackson. Due to his stay there, the Taylor house in Jonesboro has been preserved. In 1776 John Edwards married Ruth Crabtree from Bedford County, Va. She had a brother living in Burke County (now Yancey). I suppose that was the reason John and Ruth moved to Yancey, settling in the area now known as Crabtree. which was named for her brother. Two years later John and Ruth applied for a divorce. Deeds show John got all the lands consisting of several hundred acre's Ruth received only a roam mare and a feather bed. Of the eight recorded children they were: William, Sally, Meredith, James, John Jr., Steven, Anna and Edmond. John, James and Edmond fought in the War of 1812.



YANCEY HISTORY ASSOCIATION PROPOSED BYLAWS CHANGES

The following recommendations are from John Beaver, Director of the Western Regional Branch of the NC Archives and History in Asheville. He made a site visit and examined our records closely in November 2006, meeting with Elaine Dellinger, Howard "Smitty" Smith and Colette Blankenship.

The changes are in five main areas:

- Section II. Organizational: Terms of Office for the Executive Board of Directors
 - 3 yr. term (2 rotate off this year, 2 the next year and 2 on the third year) this will set in place the staggered terms in an effort for no more than two (2) vacancies each year thereafter.
 - President will not rotate to the position of at large director with the new plan.
 - Vice-President (president-elect) will be more clearly defined in the text.
 - Any unexpected vacancy mid term will be appointed by the board of directors as the interim for the remainder of the term and will be obligated to the same length of term.
 - The Secretary shall serve as Parliamentarian
- Section III. Membership: A Probationary Period for New Members
 - New Association Members must have been a member for more than six months before being eligible to vote.
 To distinguish them from junior members in the text, they will be referred to as Association Members.
 - <u>Junior Members</u> will be defined as members under the voting age of 21, having all rights relating to membership with the exception of voting privileges until they become 21 years of age.
 - <u>Dues</u> means an individual (one), a family (two or more people living within the same household and budget).

3. Section I. Organizational: Add a Section Regarding Employee/s

Clearly state that the association shall employee one part time museum manager, who shall provide the day to day operations of the association as well as tours, exhibits and displays in the museum itself. All board members will be expected to lend support and assistance as indicated. The text relating to Curator should be removed.

4. Section V. Elections:

Note: If all members are to be included in the voting process, a provision needs to be made to have voting done by a written ballot which has been mailed to the current voting members. Otherwise, only a few make the decision for many if the vote is taken at and during the annual meeting only. More work needs to be done on this section.

5. Section I. Organizational:

 Consider expanding the board from two directors at large to either four directors at large

Or


Creating, as previously proposed, a 1st and 2nd Vice-President

And

Adding a position of Historian.

- One Further Revision is being proposed after more close review of the above.
 - We propose the standing committees that have already been approved now have one more revision. In order to complete all the work required by the board.
 - We propose the chairman of each committee serve with full executive director rights as directors at large.
